GETTING STARTED IN WOOSTER

Getting to Wooster via Air

If you are arriving by airplane, you may arrive at one of three following airports. Check with your host supervisor to make arrangements for transportation from the airport to Wooster.

Akron-Canton Airport (code: CAK)

An approximately 45-minute drive on 4-lane roads from OSU Wooster, IF there are no traffic or construction delays.

BUT this airport has fewer connections from larger airports, so if your flight to/from here is delayed or cancelled you will likely have to wait longer.

Cleveland Hopkins International Airport (code: CLE)

An approximately 60-minute drive, mostly on Interstate Highway 71, IF there are no traffic or construction delays. **clevelandairport.com**

John Glenn Columbus International Airport

(code: CMH) An approximately 90-minute drive on 4-lane roads, IF there are no traffic or construction delays. Some people in your program may prefer to pick you up at this airport, although it is further away, if they are going to Columbus anyway for other OSU reasons. flycolumbus.com

The person taking the skills test must be accompanied by an adult licensed driver in the passenger seat for the entire test.

Taxis

Several taxi companies in Wooster are in flux. Many students use ridesharing apps such as **Lyft** and **Uber.** It is advisable to tip the driver 10%-15% of the fare unless service is not good.

Buses

The city bus system is called the **Wooster Transit woostertransit.com**. It is free to ride with a university identification card called the BuckID.

Cars

Driving a car in Wooster requires that you get an Ohio Driver's license. A valid International Driver's License is **NOT** sufficient proof of validity to drive because you are considered a resident for driving purposes and not a tourist. To study for the driver's license written test, get a copy of the *Digest of Ohio Motor Vehicles Laws* handbook at **http://www.bmv.ohio.gov/forms-general.aspx**

Bikes

Riding a bike on the city streets can be challenging with many cars so learning the traffic rules and how to share the road with cars is essential. Campus bike safety is also helpful to know.

Go to Your Host Department

Visit your host department after you arrive in Wooster. The department's Human Resource Professional will assist you in getting a University Identification Card and help you with matters related to employment if applicable.

Checking-in and Orientation

Bring your passport, DS-2019 form(s), and I-94 information to the session. Orientation will include information on immigration regulations and much more.

Enroll in a Health Insurance Plan

Enclosed is handout entitled, *Preparing for U.S. Health Care and Insurance*, which will assist you with information. Also, your official "*Letter of Invitation*" from your host department will inform you about which health insurance plan(s) you are eligible to select. If you are eligible to enroll in one of the University's health plans or the Nationwide Children's Hospital's health plan, you will receive enrollment information after you arrive in Wooster.

All scholars are eligible for the **Gallagher Accident & Sickness** plan hereafter referred to as the **Gallagher A&S**. You may find more information about the Gallagher A&S plan at **www.oia.osu.edu** and click the **International Scholars** tab, click on *J-1 Visiting Scholars*, and click on *Required Health Insurance*. If you select one of the Gallagher Plans, enroll on-line using a credit card using this same website.

What to Expect for Weather

Wooster weather includes four seasons and a variety of temperatures through the year. You will need a heavy coat, hat, scarf and gloves for the winter season and a lighter coat for spring and autumn seasons. The seasons and average temperature ranges are:

Winter (Dec-March) 20 to 40 Fahrenheit / -7 to +4 Celsius Spring (March-June) 30 to 70 Fahrenheit / 15 to 20 Celsius Summer (June-Sept.) 60 to 85 Fahrenheit / 2 to 25 Celsius Autumn (Sept-Dec.) 35 to 77 Fahrenheit / 2 to 25 Celsius
